



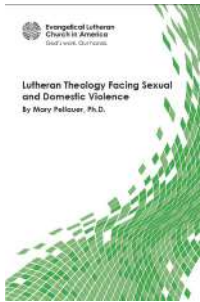

Lutheran Theology Facing Sexual and Domestic Violence

One necessary step in addressing domestic and sexual abuse, argues Mary Pellauer, theologian and survivor of sexual abuse, is to name the problems in Lutheran theology for survivors and to renew Lutheran theology in ways that strengthen the church's abilities to address such violence. Pellauer addresses the deeply-seated legacy of Luther's thought that potentially permeates the Lutheran tradition and entreats Lutherans to explore the ways that Luther's ideas on marriage, sexuality, men and women, and authority continue to run unexamined through social and religious discourse.
