SUBJECT: Report of the Parish Lay Ministry Academy, April 2025

We are grateful to Madeline Richard for her work as Dean of the Parish Lay Academy. Upon her move out of state, Jeanne Heggen accepted the position of Dean of the English-speaking module. Pr Jesus Escamilla continues his tenure as the Dean of the Spanish-speaking module.

During the Covid pandemic, we began PLMA classes taught via Zoom. The English track continues this practice as it enables students from conferences outside of the metroplex join in. A blessing in disguise! The Spanish track continues to meet in person as this better suits their needs.

An exciting thing happened last spring when Jeanne received a call from a Wartburg seminarian who was part of a collaborative team of three Wisconsin and Iowa Synods. They wanted to develop a Lay Program of their own, and after investigating several other synod academies', they decided ours was the model they liked best. They asked if they could add 3-5 students to our (English track) classes to get them started in developing a program of their own. We agreed and it's working out marvelously!

Our Fall 2024 class was a total of 20 students: 12 from the NTL and 3 from the synods up north in the English module, and five in the Spanish module. Thanks to Pastors Kendra Mohn, Paul Mussachio, Kathryn Saunders-Allen, Jesus Escamilla, Irma Banales, and Moises Carrasquillo for their teaching talents.

On February 1st, at the synod's home base, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Irving, we graduated nine students: six from the English module and three from the Latinx module. These students brought all their mentors, family and friends, and it was a full house! Congratulations go to the following:
